- a. Contact (gown / gloves)
- b. Masks
  - i. Surgical / procedure
  - ii. N95
- c. Eye protection
  - i. Face shield on mask
  - ii. Stand-alone face shield
  - iii. As part of CAPR / PAPR

# 2. Types of precautions

- a. Standard
- b. Enhanced droplet
  - i. Gown / gloves
  - ii. Mask
    - 1. Surgical
    - 2. Expired N95
  - iii. Eye
    - 1. face shield
    - 2. shield on surgical mask
    - 3. goggles
- c. Enhanced airborne
  - i. Gown / gloves
  - ii. Eye (either face shield / goggles / CAPR or PAPR)
  - iii. Mask (either N95 or CAPR / PAPR)

## 3. <u>Different situations needing PPE</u>

- a. General pt (not PUI or confirmed COVID)
  - i. Per diagnosis ...
- b. COVID PUI / confirmed
  - i. Critically ill / in ICU or aerosol generating procedure
    - 1. Enhanced airborne
  - ii. NOT in ICU and NO aerosol generating procedure
    - 1. Enhanced droplet

#### 4. Ways to preserve PPE

- a. Appropriate PPE selection!
- b. Continuous use (see AKN documents)
- c. Re use
  - i. NOT surgical masks
  - ii. N95 until visibly soiled / wet / somehow integrity compromised

- Surgical mask over N95
- Cleaning N95 w oxivir or other
- Wearing N95 for all patients
- Re using surgical mask
